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3:00 p.m. – 4:30 p.m.	<p><b>Session 5 ~ Federal Clean Fuel Standards</b></p> <p><b>Description: Environment Climate Change Canada:</b> The Clean Fuel Standard (CFS) are federal regulations being developed under the Canadian Environmental Protection Act 1999 and has the objective of achieving annual reductions of 30 megatonnes of GHG emissions by 2030. Under the CFS, natural gas distributors will be required to reduce the carbon intensity of the fuels they supply. Electricity providers and renewable natural gas producers will be included in the regulations under the market based mechanism and are potential credit generators. The presentation on the CFS is intended to inform CAMPUT members of the regulations and the implications on their regulated communities and to begin discussions on where we could collaborate to avoid duplication in regulatory requirements and burden on our industries.</p> <p><b>Description: Canadian Gas Association:</b> The federal CFS will impact Canada’s 20 million natural gas consumers.
